This scholarship was established in loving memory of Carrie Mayer-Cowan and Benjamin Mayer. Carrie was a 1994 Honor Graduate of Lexington High School and Benjamin was a 2000 Honor Graduate of LHS.

While at LHS, Carrie was an active participant in student government, a varsity cheerleader, and a member of the LHS Track Team. She also participated in the Teacher Cadet program. In 1998 she graduated from the College of Charleston with a bachelor's degree in Biology.

Following graduation, Carrie chose a career path that allowed her to fulfill her passion for the earth's oceans and for all of nature. For two years, she worked as a Marine Science Educator for the Catalina Island Marine Institute, off the coast of Los Angeles, CA. During that time, she was also an Education Intern at the Monterey Bay Aquarium. Upon leaving Catalina, she taught Marine Science at the Marine Resources Development Foundation of Key Largo, FL.

Soon afterward she began to share her passion for wildlife with students in the public schools of South Carolina. While teaching at St. John's High School in Charleston County and then at Hanahan High School in Berkeley County, she pursued a degree in Educational Leadership at the Citadel. Carrie was a member of St. Stephen's Lutheran Church in Lexington, the SC Marine Educator's Association and the SC Wildlife Federation. She was married to Joe Cowan.

While at LHS, Benjamin was a member of the 1999 State Champion SAT Team and the Wildcat Staff. He was a National Merit Commended Student. In 2004 he graduated from Clemson University with a bachelor's degree in Civil Engineering.

Benjamin was employed with Mabry Engineering of Columbia. He was a member of and often volunteered with the SC Wildlife Federation. He was a gifted artist and writer with a passion for life and possessed natural warmth that brought a smile to all he encountered. Benjamin was a member of St. Stephen's Lutheran Church in Lexington.

Carrie and Benjamin's parents, Charles A. and Nancy Jo Harmon Mayer have both been employees of Lexington School District One. Charles Mayer was an Assistant Principal at Lexington High School for 20 years. Jo Mayer was a classroom teacher for many years, Assistant Principal at Gilbert High School for five years, and the Principal of White Knoll High School for seven years. She also served as Director of Employee Quality for the district.

Who is eligible to apply for this scholarship?

- The \$1,000 scholarship is available for a **Lexington High School** graduating senior.
- Applicants must have a 3.5 grade point average and an 1150 SAT or 24 ACT.
- This scholarship is for a student pursuing a college degree in science education or engineering at a four-year college or university in South Carolina.

- The scholarship is issued one time only and is not renewable.
- The scholarship award will be paid by a check made jointly to the student and the selected institution of higher education.

 - a. State your career goals and reasons for choosing your field of study. What circumstances or which individuals have influenced your choice?
 - b. Explain why you should receive this scholarship and what it would mean to you if you were chosen as this year's scholarship award recipient.
