



Lucinda Eargle Millman Family Scholarship for Pelion High School

DEADLINE: March 15, 2023 2023 Scholarship: \$4,000 total*

*Recurring \$1,000 per year for up to 4 years as long as scholarship terms are met.

Born in Columbia, SC, Lucinda Eargle Millman is a Pelion High School graduate from the Class of 1984. She and her husband, David, want to support PHS graduates who are pursuing a college degree, so decided to create a scholarship to assist them in their pursuit of higher education.

The scholarship award is recurring as long as the recipient maintains a 3.0 GPA in college as evidenced by an official college transcript provided to Educational Foundation staff at the end of each year.

Scholarship Criteria & Selection Process

In honoring Mrs. Millman and her family, this scholarship will be awarded to a Lexington District One graduating senior from Pelion High School who has excelled academically and shares some of Mrs. Millman's past high school interests. Specific requirements are below:

1. Lexington District One Pelion High School senior who will graduate in May of the current school year.
2. Preference will be given to student who will attend a four-year college that is located outside of South Carolina immediately upon graduation in order to pursue a degree. Second order of preference will be given to a student who will attend a private, four-year college in South Carolina.
3. Minimum GPA of 3.0 (or equivalent B) average is required in high school coursework.
4. Student must be an active member in good-standing in the PHS Beta Club and/or the DECA Club.
5. Student who completes all application requirements thoroughly and thoughtfully.

Applicants will be selected by a Lexington One Educational Foundation Scholarship Committee based on information included in the scholarship application. Results will be announced at the senior high school awards ceremony in May, which the scholarship recipient must attend.

Application Requirements / How to Apply

1. Complete the scholarship application including the short-response questions.
2. Request an official high school transcript from the Pelion High School Counseling Office staff to be included in the scholarship application packet.
3. Include additional documentation (if needed) that may be helpful to the scholarship selection committee (e.g., high school resume).
4. Submit all requested information to the high school counseling office on or before the deadline.
5. Must attend the senior high school awards program that is scheduled in May if selected for the scholarship.

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How the scholarship is awarded: Recipient must sign and return Educational Foundation's Scholarship Agreement Form (that is given to the recipient at the high school awards night) to the Lexington One Educational Foundation in order for checks to be processed in July and November (\$500 each). Checks are made payable to the chosen college/university and the scholarship recipient.

In order for the scholarship recipient to receive the scholarship award the following year, he/she must maintain a 3.0 GPA in college and submit an official transcript to the Educational Foundation staff immediately upon completion of the second semester. Upon verification of grades, the student will be eligible to receive the \$1,000 scholarship award for the following year for a total award of up to \$4,000 in four years.
